- **Instructor Absence or Travel:** some instructors may have pre-existing dates they will be unavailable. You will be notified on your class confirmation form of specific dates.

Please pay close attention to the dates and times when each class will be conducted, as there are variations between classes. Classes held on Mon, Tues, Thurs and Fri will be from 2:30 – 3:30 pm, and Wednesday classes will be from 1:30-2:30 pm. All classes will be one (1) hour long.

Students will be released after their class(es) to A+ if they are participants or to the front of the office at the end of each class session.

It is because of your continued dedication that we are able to offer the EdVenture After School Enrichment Program to enrich and enhance the education of our students.

EdVenture Registration Instructions and Information

- **All registrations will be handled on a first-come-first-served basis.** At the time of registration, students will receive a confirmation slip for their registered class(es). **Please keep this confirmation slip for your records, as it will contain specific information on the class your child is registered, including dates, times, and location of class.**
- Either parent or student may register for classes. Parents who wish to have their child attending A+ register for classes may do so, *HOWEVER* due to safety concerns, a permission note **MUST** be sent to A+ prior to the date of registration. Failure to do so will result in your child not being released to register from A+. Parents also need to remember that supervision will not be provided during these times. School policy does not allow students on campus unsupervised after school hours if they do not attend the A+ After School program.
- Tuition for classes range from \$30.00 - \$45.00 depending on the cost of supplies which students get to consume, take home and/or keep.
- **Tuition payment is due at the time of registration.** If paying by check, please **make checks payable to E. B. deSilva PTA.** In the case of returned checks due to insufficient funds, you will be assessed a returned check fee minimum of \$25.00 up to the maximum amount allowable by law and in accordance with your banking institution.
- Class size will be limited to 10 students per class, with some exceptions, dependent on the instructor with approval from EdVenture staff. Parents are encouraged to sign up to be on the waiting lists for classes if their preferred classes are filled. We will make every effort to fill all available spaces.
- Classes will be limited to 2 per student to allow others to have the chance to register for classes. If there are any classes that have openings after the registration date, parents will be notified and will be allowed to enroll students in classes over the 2 per student limit.
- One (1) \$30 scholarship per student is available upon request to students who qualify for free or reduced lunch on a limited basis. If taking more than one class, the scholarship will be applied to the class of lesser value. The difference of the cost in choosing a class with a higher registration fee is the responsibility of the parent/guardian. Parent/guardian **MUST** submit a copy of the "Free and Reduced Lunch Approval Letter" to qualify when contacted by the PCNC immediately following registration.
- Parents may start lining up at 4:00 p.m. - and **no earlier.** This will be strictly enforced. Please also stay away from the immediate area of the library. We ask parents to respectfully refrain from coming onto the campus until 3:30 p.m. This allows our teachers the time to leave the campus, free-up parking stalls, and keep congestion to a minimum.

FALL 2015 EdVenture CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

A Whale of a Time! (Grade 2)

A class specifically designed to introduce ceramics to Grade 2 students. Second graders will learn to make simple pinch pots and coil pots, work with texturing using bright, cheerful glazes and choosing animals to sculpt from clay. Instructor and local artist Fair Jenkins owns her own studio, and has extensive experience working with different media and teaching children of various ages.

BBoyz and Girlz Hip Hop (Grades 4-6)

Participants will learn how to use their bodies in one of the most full body athletic dance forms, including basic hip-hop, break dance steps and basic freezes (poses). Participants will also work on free-styling (solos). The instructor will lead participants in proper warm ups and will announce recommended safety gear to bring in order to keep this an injury free class. The instructor for this class will be Norman Hakkei, Jr., aka "Junior," a break dancer for 8 years and break dance instructor at Center Stage Dance Studio Hilo for the past two years. "Junior" has won several break dance competitions throughout Hawai'i.

Badminton (Grades 3-5)

Students will enjoy learning basic badminton moves, maneuvers, game play, & scoring in this class taught by Mr. Ryan Perroy. Mr. Perroy is an assistant professor in the Geography & Environmental Studies Department at UH Hilo, and is a former Captain of the William & Mary Badminton Team.

Beginner's Hula (Grades 2-4)

Students will learn the basic hula steps: kaholo, ami, ka'o, etc. and over the course of the classes will learn to dance to 4-5 different holiday songs in a culturally rich environment. They will also learn to make yarn lei in this class. Taught by Ruth Kau, who has extensive experience teaching and performing hula both locally and on the mainland. Mrs. Kau is also a current EB deSilva parent who enjoys volunteering in her children's classrooms on campus.

Cards & Crafts (Grades 3-4)

Students will be creating cards and crafts for different occasions and special events, incorporating a variety of medium including stamping into their creations. Crafts will be based on skill level and be age appropriate. Instructor and long-time crafter Sandi Ozeki will be returning to share her love of crafting and working with students.

Chess Champs (Grades 4-6)

Chess is a wonderful game for developing logic, strategy and memory skills. It is a game of maneuvers, creative thinking and how to best overcome obstacles. It enhances the creative process of our minds and builds excitement in engagement. Loving the game is more important than winning; however winning allows you to progress in skill but not at the expense of another. This class will be taught by Jon Neet, a chess tournament player, former Elementary school chess club coach and member of the US Chess Federation.

Clay Creations and Explorations (Grades 4-6)

This class will be for both beginners and advanced ceramic students. Techniques and projects that capture the interest of the older students will be featured in this class. Students will also be creating tiles to be used in an on-going legacy project that will feature students' works of art around the campus. Local artist and art instructor Fair Jenkins will be sharing her talents with students in this class.

Easy Peasy Block Printing (Grades 3-5)

Students will learn to design three "block printing stamps or plates" to be used in the introduction to print making. Creations will include notecards, bookmarks and wrapping paper that can be used for the holidays and gift-giving. Taught by renowned artist Kathleen Kam, whose murals and major works of art can be seen in Volcano Village, the Ka'u Coffee Mill, Downtown KTA and the Kamehameha Elementary School campus on O'ahu. Since 1999, Kathleen has taught as an Artistic Teaching Partner with the Hawaii Arts Alliance.

Hand-Puppet Making (Grades 3-5)

Students will be crafting hand-puppets using homemade clay. Project starts with learning how to make their own clay using household materials, e.g. toilet paper, corn starch, glue, baby oil and drywall mud! Followed by drawing an image of what their puppet will look like, then forming the facial features, hands/arms, legs, etc. After all pieces are dried, they're painted and finally assembled using cloth gloves for the body. Instruction will also involve creating the "voice" or character of their puppets. Kathleen Kam will be the featured instructor for this class.

Hip Hop Jazz! (Grades 1-3)

Learn Jazz and Hip Hop Basics in this fun and upbeat class! Instructor Malia Okimura has been practicing different forms of dance since the age of 3, and is excited to share her talent and passion for dance with her students. She has taught classes at Center Stage and Big Island Dance Academy as well as assisted various other dance instructors. Students are asked to wear shoes and shorts to class sessions.

Hooked on Crochet (Grades 4-6)

Students will learn crochet basics to create different projects: hacky sacks, beanies and others. Class is taught by Bernalyn Young, a PPT in Mrs. Yamashita's 4th grade class

Hula With Kumu Hula Kalima (Grades K-2)

Young students will have the opportunity to learn hula basics as well as Hawaiian culture and language with visiting instructor, Kumu Hula Iwalani Kalima. Born and raised in Hilo, Kumu Kalima has taught hula in the school system as well as at her halau. She has studied under premier Kumu Hula George Naope and also has hula studios in Japan.

Junior Iron Chef (Grades 4-6)

Become the "Iron Chef" of your family and learn how to make easy, delicious and nutritious meals for you and your ohana. Participants will also learn table manners, importance of eating together as a family, and why eating healthy and balanced meals including vegetables and fruits is important. Class will be taught by Audrey Wilson, who has a degree in Home Economics from UH-Manoa and writes a weekly food column for the Hawaii Tribune-Herald. Ms. Wilson has written numerous cookbooks and loves to travel abroad whenever she can.

Kinder Crafts (Kindergarten)

Craft fun in the afternoon will have the kindergarteners creating seasonal themed projects to share and display. Projects chosen will be age and skill appropriate. Students will be working on projects using different types of craft mediums, such as paints, glue, & markers as well as incorporating theme projects. Instructor Myra Halpern is looking forward to working with the Kindergarteners in this class.

Manners in Momentum (Grades 1-3 and 1-6)

"Children need the gift of good manners and core values training to prepare them for adulthood" - Astania Caputo, Etiquette Trainer and Class Instructor. A fun, interesting, and relevant class that teaches greetings, please, thank you, mistakes, tact, apologies, & rudeness through differing situational interactions. When NO is appropriate, gift giving, attending a party, table manners, hygiene, bullying, teasing, verbal/nonverbal communications, texting and phone manners. Friday class will include mentor training for students who have taken the class previously.

Munch Time!

Got the urge to snack, but don't know what to eat? Learn to prepare healthy snacks and treats in this class featuring instructor Dean Shigeoka, a local caterer and son of Audrey Wilson, who teaches the Jr Iron Chef class.

My BEST Moves (Grades K-2)

Students will learn the fundamentals of dance through B.E.S.T. (Body, Energy, Space, Time) while developing individual creativity. Using props, this class focuses on balance, coordination, rhythm, group work, and confidence. This class will be taught by Vicky Robbins, a Teaching Artist with The State Foundation on Culture and the Arts and Hawaii Arts Alliance, and has been an EdVenture instructor for a number of years.

Oriental Crafts (Grades 5-6)

Learn different forms of art in this class that focuses on the various special events that occur during the Fall Season. Students will also learn the significance of the different holidays, and how they are celebrated in the Orient. Crafter and owner/operator of Hand to Hand Crafts, Hiroko Takayama, shares her talent, creativity, and love of crafting with the students in her classes.

Pitch Perfect Bees (Grades 3-6)

Learn singing techniques and have fun harmonizing with Instructor Dena Higashi, who is a PPT in Mr Yamaki's class. Students will also learn to make microphones and other music related crafts in the class.

Science Wizards (Grades K and 1)

Students will be taught scientific process/inquiry, observation skills and participate in hands on science experiments. From observing earthworms, ivory soap microwave bubbles, learning about plants and root systems, matter, forward motion and magnets - this class offers a wide-range of topics in a fun-filled environment to keep your child engaged and designed to foster a love of science. Instructor Jessica Souder, was most recently a classroom teacher at Keaukaha Elementary School, and is currently spending time raising her family.

Sketch It! (Grades 1-4)

Beginning sketch classes will focus on basic sketch techniques, shading, coloring and include introduction to simple painting. Taught by Kellie Miyazu, who has experience in graphics arts production, freelance artwork, and teaching. Ms. Miyazu is the recipient of the 2012 UH Hilo College of Arts and Sciences "Dean's Exhibit Award".

Super Bees Play with Clay (Grades 2-3)

Students learn to explore art through creating ceramics pieces learning different techniques and tricks as well as adding texture and dimension in creating their works of art. Taught by Paula Hatanaka, long-time Hilo resident and ceramicist. Paula has extensive background teaching ceramics classes as well as an independent business owner. Her pieces are well recognized in the community.

Super Bee Yogies (Grades K-6)

Introducing children to hatha yoga, encouraging a joyous and playful curiosity towards healthy exercise and respectful relations with oneself and others through the use of asana (physical postures), yamas and niyamas (social and personal guidelines). This class will be taught by Yoga Instructor Catherine "Cat" Southern, who has been with the EdVenture Program for a number of years.

Volleyball Bees (Grades 3-6)

Introducing children to the game of volleyball, students will benefit from group and individualized interactions. Each child will learn the basic skills and general techniques of passing, setting, hitting, blocking and serving the volleyball. Having fun while learning the game of volleyball is the main focus of these sessions. Classes will be taught by Jasen Suwa, who is one of our A+ Afterschool program aides and an active volleyball coach and player. Jasen brings an extensive background including: 17 year participant in the Haili Volleyball Tournament, past coach at Waiakea High School (boys and girls), and was a member of the All Tournament Team for USA Jr Nationals in Atlanta, Georgia.
